

Indigenous Land Use Agreement with The Northern Territory Government

Here Artepe Aboriginal Corporation (LAAC) and the NT Government are currently negotiating an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) for native title to be extinguished over 5 parcels of land in Alice Springs. The land will be used for residential, industrial and commercial development, and in exchange, the NT Government will deliver on a \$20 million package of benefits over a 10 year period, resulting in positive outcomes for Arrernte people.

Package of Benefits

The NT Government wishes to explore the following package of benefits, comprising a Settlement Package (SP) and Collaboration and Capacity Building Agreement (CCBA). The package was presented to the Lhere Artepe board on 13 September 2019 and to the LAAC estate groups on 14 December 2019.

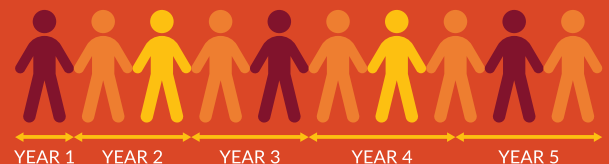

These consultations are in accordance with Lhere Artepe's statutory obligations as a Prescribed Body Corporate under the Native Title Act and its Rule Book. The final package is subject to approval by Lhere Artepe and the NT Government, and certification by the Central Land Council that it has been consulted.
